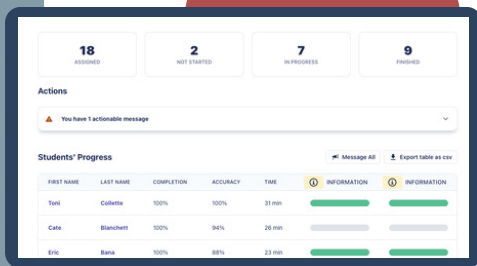

Our progress tab indicates how students are engaging with a task. Gain a clear picture of students who may need support by using our analytics and progress tools to inform your next teaching steps.

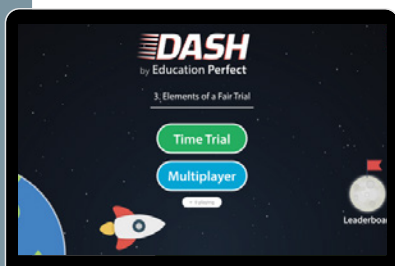
Assessment Insights

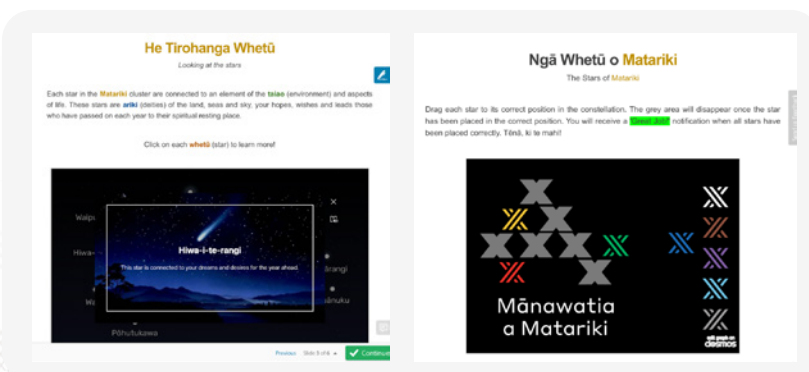

Gagana Sāmoa

O lau gagana o lou fa'asinomaga—
Language is your identity.



As teachers, we all know language, culture and identity are central to our students' health and sense of belonging. Samoan teachers are a rare taonga and gagana Sāmoa is in decline. This is why EP is proud and excited to partner with the Ministry of Education to offer a beginners' Samoan course of 30 lessons, **FREE to all schools** across the motu.

Formal Greetings / Mālō le Soifua, Mālō Lava le Soifua

A common **formal way** of greeting someone in the gagana Sāmoa is **mālō le soifua** (mah-loh-leh-soy-foo-ah). **Le** means 'the' and **soifua** means 'health' or 'life'. Using this particular phrase, you are greeting someone in good health.

You may also **emphasise** this greeting by using the word **lava** straight after 'mālō': **mālō lava le soifua** (mah-loh-lah-var-leh-soy-foo-ah) / very good health to you.

This greeting is mainly used to be more **formal** or show respect, i.e. when speaking to an elder or someone of high regard to you. You will often hear it used in formal settings such as a church or work meetings.



An Introduction to Greetings / Fa'afeiloa'iga Formal Greetings

How Many People? / E To'afia?

When we ask about the number of **people**, we use the same sentence structure as the one to ask about objects but with a small add-on of to'a before fia:

E to'afia (people)? / How many people?

To respond to the question, we use **to'a** and **replace fia with the correct number**:

E to'a (number) (people) / There are (number) (people).

Examples:

E to'afia teine? / How many girls are there?
E to'atolu teine. / There are three girls.

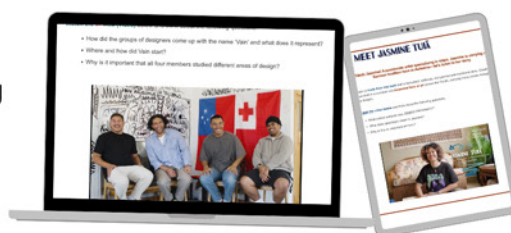

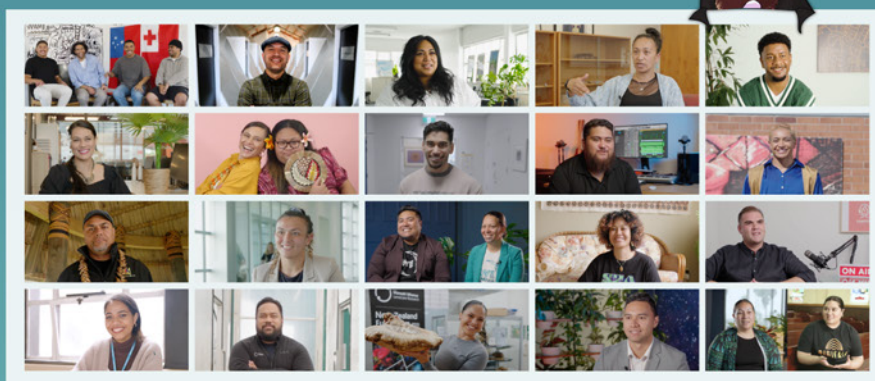

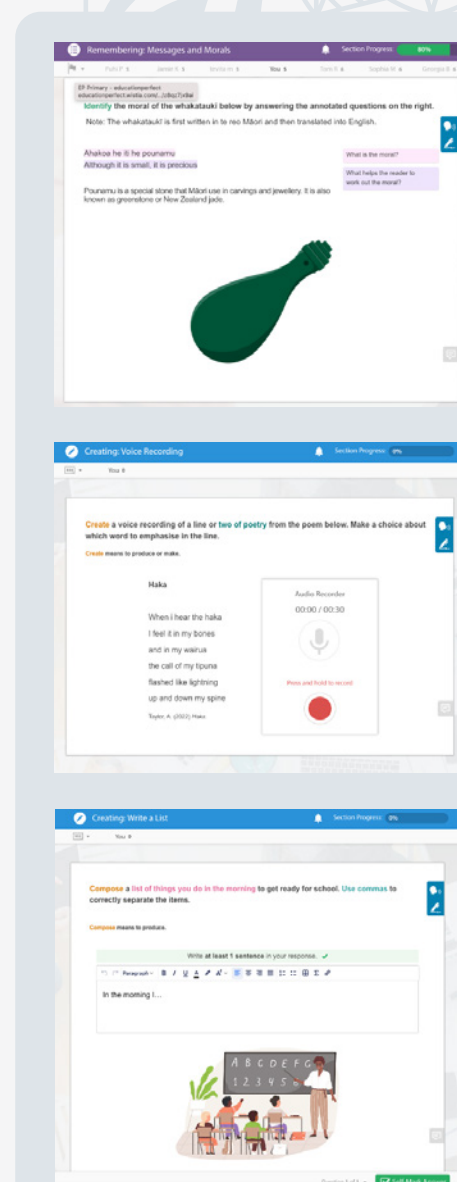
